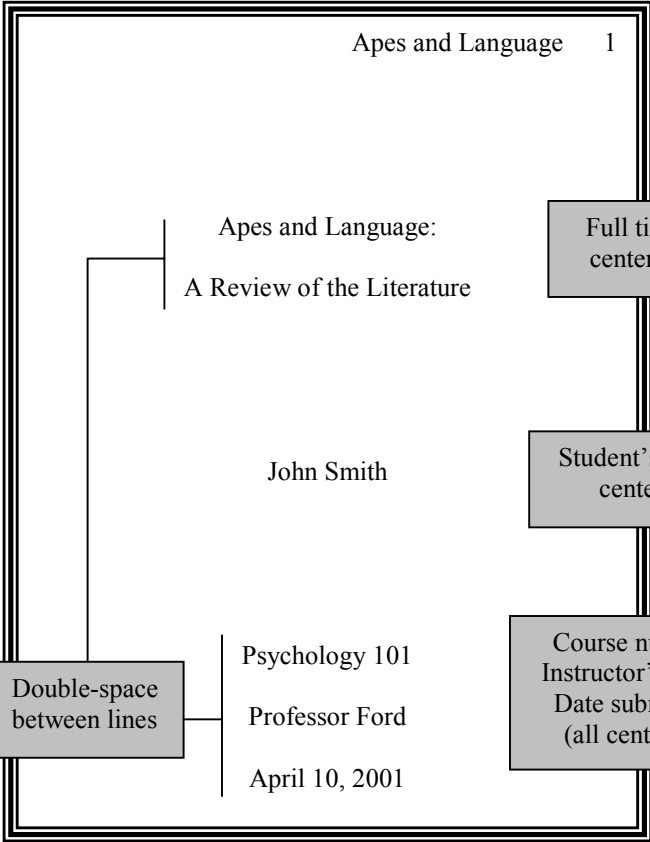


APA STYLE - RESEARCH PAPER FORMAT

Title page



Research paper header (i.e., short title consisting of 3 -5 words) and page number (five spaces apart) in the top right corner. Page numbering starts on the title page.

Full title, centered

Student's name, centered

Course number
Instructor's name
Date submitted
(all centered)

Double-space between lines

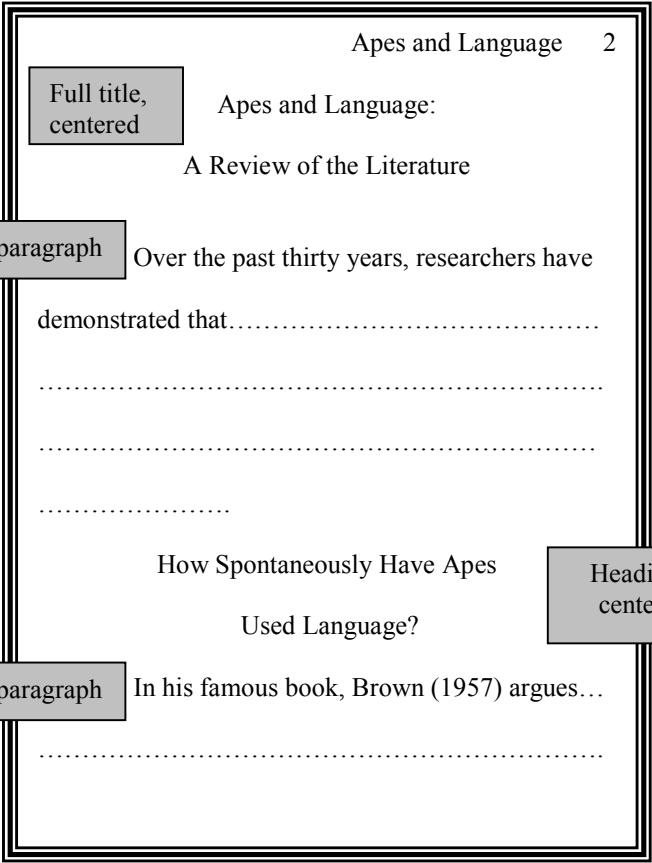
Text of the paper

Margins:
1 in. on each side

Typeface:
12-pt Times Roman

Line spacing:
Double-space between all lines of the paper

Paragraphs and Indentation:
Indent the first line of every paragraph and the first line of every footnote.



Research paper header and page number appear on each page in the top right corner.

Full title, centered

Indented paragraph

Headings, centered

Research paper header and page number appear on each page in the top right corner.

List of references begins on a new page. Heading is centered.

Entries are alphabetized by authors' last names.

If there is no author, the title moves to the author position, and the entry is alphabetized by the first significant word of the title.

Double-spacing is used throughout.

References are arranged in a hanging indent format, i.e. the first line of an entry is at the left margin; subsequent lines indent ½" (or five spaces).
